He also alleged that the pharmacy technician did not look him up properly in the computer system and said he was from Tennessee. The Pharmacy Manager responded that he asked the complainant what kind of insulin he used and how many units. The complainant declined to provide this information. The pharmacist responded that she did not know what the prescriber was treating and did not feel comfortable providing that information without speaking to the physician first. A complainant alleged that over the last twenty (20) months, his Adderall prescription (dosed four times daily) is consistently lost, missing pills, or out of stock. The complainant alleged that his insurance will pay for ninety (90) of the tablets monthly, but he has to pay out of pocket for the remaining thirty (30) tablets and feels this is leading to issues with the pharmacy. The Pharmacist-in-Charge ("PIC") responded that the complainant's profile has been reviewed for the last six (6) months and the prescriptions have either been filled on the day the prescriber requested or on the day the prescription was allowed to be filled. The PIC responded that the complainant's insurance will only cover 3 times/day dosing, leaving the patient to pay out of pocket for the remaining thirty (30) tablets. The PIC responded that sometimes the prescriber will prescribe the full quantity of #120, and other times write one (1) prescription for quantity #90 and another prescription for quantity #30, which complicated the issue. The pharmacy has documentation that the complainant wishes to pay out of pocket for the remaining thirty (30) tablets each month to assist in receiving his full dose of medication.

22-0102

A complainant alleged that a pharmacist refused to fill his prescription for ivermectin prior to knowing if it was for COVID-19 treatment. The complainant alleged that the pharmacist stated that ivermectin is not FDA-approved for COVID-19, nor would he fill it for treating COVID-19. The complainant alleged that he did not say whether he had COVID-19, and he was not exhibiting any symptoms. The pharmacist responded that he informed the complainant that he would be unable to refill the prescription due to current FDA guidelines advising against the use of ivermectin for COVID-19 treatment and/or prevention. The pharmacist explained he was basing his clinical judgement on FDA guidance and provided the complainant with a copy of the guideline.

Use of professional judgment to address a prescription order.

22-0094

A complainant alleged that he did not receive his prescription on time. The complainant alleged that his Oxycontin prescription has always been written for quantity #90 tablets with directions to take 3 tablets daily. The complainant alleged that a new prescription was sent to the pharmacy on January 31, 2022, and when he did not receive it by February 7, 2022, he called and was told the insurance would not cover the medication until February 14, 2022. The previous prescription was written for quantity #90 tablets with directions to take 2 tablets daily (45-day supply). The complainant alleged that he was told to have his doctor send in a revised prescription and to call the insurance company for an override. The complainant alleged that despite his doctor sending multiple prescriptions, he was told the prescription would not be processed and the information was wrong. The complainant alleged the staff were rude and endangered his life. The Pharmacist-in-Charge ("PIC") responded that a prescription was received on January 4, 2022, for OxyContin 60 mg, quantity #90, with directions to take one tablet by mouth every morning and evening. This was filled correctly as a 45-day supply. On February 8, 2022, the complainant called the pharmacy stating that he takes three (3) tablets daily. The pharmacist he spoke to stated he would contact the prescriber to request a new prescription. The new prescription did not reflect an updated dose of three (3) tablets daily. On February 9, 2022, the pharmacist contacted the prescriber to clarify the new prescription. A representative of the prescriber indicated a new prescription would be sent to the pharmacy. On February 11, 2022, a new prescription was received with the updated dosage. The new prescription was filled and shipped overnight to the complainant.
