There are numerous requirements for youth under 18 to receive a driver's license. This brochure explains what you need to do to become a first-time driver.

Idaho youth can participate in a driver's training program at age 14 ½ and receive a restricted driver's license at age 15.

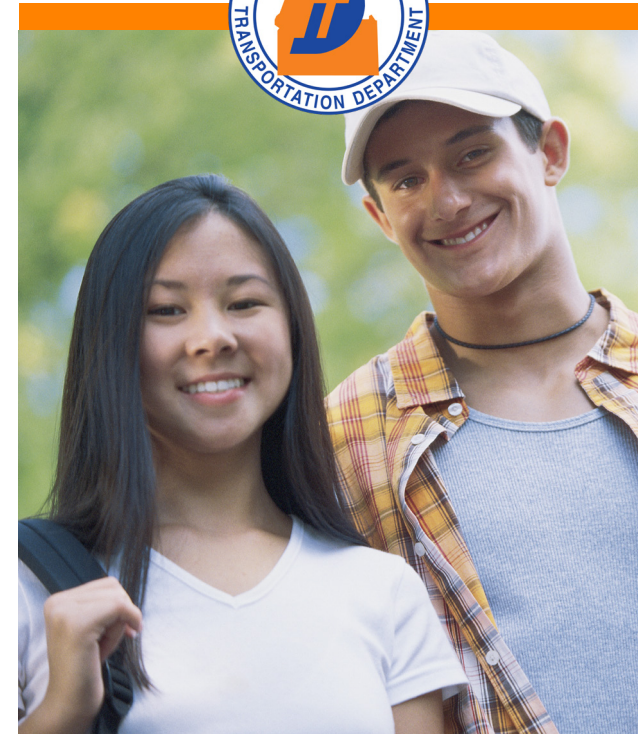

APPLICANTS UNDER 18

If you are under 18 years old, you must:

- Provide acceptable proof of enrollment and attendance at or graduation from a recognized high school or equivalent program. Your attendance or graduation can be verified by providing one of the following:
 - Verification of compliance form from a recognized high school or equivalent program
 - High school diploma
 - High school equivalency
- Have a parent or legal guardian accompany you to your county Sheriff's DMV office and sign a consent form. The signer assumes legal responsibility for your actions.

APPLICANTS UNDER 17

If you are under 17 years old, you must also do the following:

- Complete and proof of an approved driver's training program.
- Complete the requirements of the Graduated Driver License Program. In this program, you will be required to:
 - Complete a minimum six-month violation-free supervised instruction period with a licensed driver over age 21
 - Accumulate at least 50 hours of supervised driving time, of which 10 hours must be at night
- Have a parent or legal guardian accompany you to your county Sheriff's DMV office and sign a consent form. The signer assumes legal responsibility for your actions.
- Provide proof you have completed both the driver's training and Graduated Driver License programs.

Where do I begin?



Pass your tests. Complete and pass the following tests at your county Sheriff's DMV office:

- Vision screening test
- Knowledge test
- Road skills test



Apply in person. Apply for the driver's license at your county Sheriff's DMV office. For the office nearest you and its hours of operation go to dmv.idaho.gov.
